

General Rules for Drone Flights on the Premises of the Stutthof Museum in Sztutowo

I. Requirements for Drone Operators Based on National Regulations:

1. The drone operator is responsible for the entire flight and all resulting consequences.
2. The drone's Maximum Take-off Mass (MTOM) must not exceed 25 kg.
3. Flights must be conducted within visual line of sight and at an altitude of up to 150 meters Above Ground Level (AGL).
4. The drone operator must carry a valid UAV qualification certificate appropriate for the drone model, issued by the Civil Aviation Authority in Warsaw. In the case of foreign licenses, the operator's qualifications must be recognized by Polish authorities responsible for aviation safety (there is no "European Union license").
5. The operator must carry valid medical certification for aviation and liability insurance (OC) for commercial flights.
6. Since the museum is located in a border zone and within the TSA 16E airspace, the operator must obtain permission from the airspace administrator before the flight.

II. Internal Requirements for Drone Operators and Clients Based on Museum Regulations:

1. Permission from the Museum Director is required to conduct drone flights on museum grounds. The application must specify, among other things: the time of the flights, their technical scope, and the intended use of the recorded footage or photographs.
2. The Museum grants permission to use drones only in special cases (e.g., for television materials or documentary films), based on the complete set of the aforementioned documents.
3. Drone flights must be conducted under the supervision of a person designated by the Museum.
4. Flights must be carried out with due attention to safety for both visitors on the museum grounds and museum objects.
5. The drone operator is fully financially and legally responsible for any damage caused during and as a result of the flights.
